Additionally, Dr. Skaff had post-doctoral emergency services, crisis intervention and stress management post-doctoral fellowship training experience at the University of Tennessee, Health Sciences Center, Regional Medical Center, Memphis Police & Fire Departments and post-911 Pentagon Task Force.

Dr. Skaff is in the Master's of Science Clinical Psycho-pharmacology Program in Baton Rouge. Her practice includes specialized evaluation, treatment, and training work with law enforcement and other emergency services and health care professionals around crisis, adjustment, job or acute/traumatic stress issues.
