Darren M. Strother is a licensed Clinical Neuropsychologist, in practice in Lafayette since 2006.

A member of the American and Louisiana Psychological Associations, and International Neuropsychological Society, Dr. Strother holds a Master's degree in experimental psychology from The University of Louisiana at Lafayette and a PhD in clinical psychology from The University of Mississippi. He completed 1-year internship at Baylor College of Medicine.

After receiving his doctorate, Dr. Strother completed a 2-year fellowship in neuropsychology at Texas Children's Hospital and Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX.

In addition to clinical practice, Dr. Strother remains active in research and his interests include: brain plasticity and cortical reorganization after neurological injury, prenatal drug exposure and attention, and the relationship between attention and memory. He has coauthored a book chapter on the efficacy of neurofeedback in the treatment of neuropsychological problems in children.

Dr. Strother's research interests led to the development of a technological device to aid medication management of AD/HD and used as an alternative treatment for AD/HD. The device has recently been awarded patent pending status by the United States Patent Office.

Dr. Strother specializes in the assessment of AD/HD, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Learning Disorders, Brain Injury, Epilepsy and Seizure Disorders, Tourrette's and Movement Disorders, Developmental Delay, Dementia, and Chronic Pain.
